Temporary Recreational Vehicle Permit Process

This permit process can begin only after El Dorado County has returned your property to you.

El Dorado County Building and Planning Department and Environmental Management each have a team dedicated solely to people who have lost or had homes damaged due to the Caldor Fire and will see people on a walk-in basis. To make an appointment call (530) 621-5315. Building and Planning began pulling research on destroyed buildings early on, so they already have knowledge of the historical permits that were used on approximately 90% of those homes.

1. **Fill out <u>Fee Waiver</u> form:** Fees may be waived for permits that are not paid by insurance, only partially paid by insurance, or in the case that the structure was uninsured.

Required documentation:

Attach to this application all written documentation establishing that the required permitting fee for any of the selected permits in the "Permitting Fee Information" section is not fully or only partially covered by your insurance company, or a written acknowledgement that you did not have insurance to cover the permitting fees.

2. Obtaining your TRV permit

Fill out the Temporary RV/MH Permit Application Part 16 C

This requires a site plan. Building services will help you with this. Included in the site plan will be marks for (1) power and (2) septic. The site plan will need to be approved by the <u>Pioneer Fire Protection District</u>

- (1) Power:
 - a. A generator is an acceptable power source until September 10, 2024
 - b. Temporary power may be installed
 - 1. Obtain a permit from El Dorado County Building Services.
 - 2. Contact PG&E to connect temporary electric service. Apply online at pge.com/cco or call 1-877-743-7782, Monday through Friday, 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. You will be assigned a dedicated PG&E Service Planning Representative (SPR) to manage your request. Please indicate on your application which wildfire your request is related to.
 - 3. Have a temporary power pole installed by an electrician. After this is completed, El Dorado County Building Services will need to inspect the temporary power installation. <u>Inspection Application</u> or <u>eTRAKIT</u>
- (2) **Septic System:** A temporary RV/MH permit will be issued only if a functioning septic system or sewer connection exists at the site.

Existing septic system

- 1. If you intend to connect your trailer to an existing septic system, an <u>inspection report</u> is required. Prior to the inspection, contact Environmental Management for septic records using the online <u>Public Records Portal</u>.
- 2. If you have any questions regarding the inspection please call 530-621-5300 and the time of your call, tell them that this inspection is Caldor fire related, and they will direct your call to a team that is specially <u>trained in this situation.</u>
- (3) **Water:** Grizzly Flats CSD has reported that their water is %100 potable and if you have a well, it is highly recommended that it be tested.
